Henry Dreyfuss (March 2, 1904 – October 5, 1972) was an American industrial designer. Dreyfuss was a native in Brooklyn, New York. As one of the celebrity industrial designers of the 1930s and 1940s, Dreyfuss dramatically improved the look, feel, and usability of dozens of consumer products.
