After replacement of brake shoes and linings, the brakes must be re-burnished to seat in the new components. This should be done by applying the brakes 0 to 30 times from an initial speed of 40 m.p.h., slowing the vehicle to 0 m.p.h. Allow ample time for brakes to cool between applications.

Pass the camshaft through the brake anchor bracket from the outboard side, slide the cam head bearing, inner rubber boots, cover plate* and spline end spherical bearing onto the camshaft.
