Transmittal A-00-40 states that Medicare requires modifier -25 "always be appended to the emergency department E/M codes when provided." 4 However, the Outpatient Code Editor only requires the use of modifier -25 when the E/M service is reported with a procedure code with a status indicator of S or T.

Principles for Emergency Department Coding Guidelines

Identify each emergency room visit by entering "1" in form locator 46. This unit value should never be greater than one when billing revenue code 450. Physician Services . Emergency physician services should not be billed with emergency room services on the UB-04.

What those guidelines say is if you're coding for the hospital outpatient department, you do not code for any diagnoses that is documented as "probable," "suspected," "questionable," "rule out," or "working diagnosis" or anything else that indicate uncertainty; so no "probable," "likely," "suspected," anything like that.

The American College of Emergency Physicians recommends a coding model that references possible interventions/procedure examples and complexity of discharge instructions to serve as proxy representation for the typical intensity of provided facility services.
