Westward Expansion (1801-1861) Westward expansion began in earnest in 1803. Thomas Jefferson negotiated a treaty with France in which the United States paid France \$15 million for the Louisiana Territory – 828,000 square miles of land west of the Mississippi River – effectively doubling the size of the young nation. The lands acquired stretched from the Mississippi River to the Rocky Mountains and from the Gulf of Mexico to the Canadian border.
